MIND, BODY, SPIRIT - AND A PUPPY!

Since it was established in 1929, St. Sebastian Parish School has been dedicated to developing the whole student: mind, body and spirit. Catholic values are placed at the center of all learning, and these values are strengthened through the religion curriculum, sacramental preparation, community service activities, daily prayers, weekly Mass, and many more programs and activities designed to guide students as they grow spiritually and morally. In recent years, St. Sebastian Parish School has taken steps to expand on this solid base with additional efforts to address the social and emotional needs of the students.

Weller, the Therapy Dog in Training

This is where the puppy comes in! Principal Anthony Rohr, who in recent years developed an appreciation of therapy dogs, tried for months to bring a therapy dog to visit our school. He was unsuccessful because all the dogs were too busy with visits to places like hospitals and senior centers or unable to visit due to pandemic protocols. But, by chance he and his wife found out about a litter of golden retriever puppies, and they realized it was a win-win situation: Their family would welcome a new dog, which would help them move forward after the recent loss of both of their family dogs, and the school would (hopefully) have regular access to a therapy dog, which would help students and teachers decrease stress and increase smiles.



Principal Rohr's puppy, Weller, will begin training to be a therapy dog this winter. While there are no guarantees that Weller is suited to be a therapy dog, Principal Rohr is hopeful that training will go well and that Weller will

start visiting the school as an official therapy dog next school year. Principal Rohr introduced Weller to the students in January with a surprise visit to all the classrooms. He shares this story of his visit with the kindergarten classes: As he was leaving, he stopped and invited one of the students to come say goodbye to Weller. The student was having a bad day and was visibly upset, but after petting Weller for a few minutes, she calmed down, her tears were replaced with a smile, and she went back to class ready to learn.

Principal Rohr notes, "This is exactly the impact a therapy dog can have: When you are able to address students' social and emotional needs, they are more successful in learning."



The Friendzy Program

In 2020, St. Sebastian Parish School began participating in "Friendzy," a national social and emotional learning program designed for schools. Friendzy, which is an official partner with the National Catholic Educational Association, aims to tackle the friendship challenges every child faces by teaching students what it means not only to have good friendships, but also how to be really good friends. Friendzy incorporates strategies for developing the social and emotional skills that research shows lead to greater success and happiness later in life. The program was founded by parents who saw the rise of smartphones and other technology result in the most technologically connected — and yet most socially disconnected — generation ever.


Classes of 1978, 1982, 1987

Mr. Shaw and his wife Donna had twin sons who graduated from St. Sebastian: **Ronald Shaw**, **Jr.** '78 and **Thomas** '78. Ron Jr. is also shown in this picture in his role as his father's assistant coach. Ronald Shaw, Sr. was a long-time basketball coach at St. Sebastian Parish School, and he also coached youth football and baseball. Coach Shaw made an impression on the lives of many of his athletes, and news of his death prompted many comments on Facebook from alumni, parishioners, and school parents who remembered him fondly. For example, **Dave Meeker** '87 commented, "I'm saddened to hear of the passing of a great guy - Mr. Ron Shaw. He was our grade school basketball coach and ... an usher at the church ... and every single time he was in that



church for a Mass and we were there, he'd come up and give the best smile and firm handshake. He was a really great person and really big part of growing up. What a beautiful human being." Marlon Balana '87 added, "Yes! He certainly and truly made an impression on me at a young age. Such a positive influence. We were so lucky to have him around us during those years."

Maria Paparella (pictured below, fifth from left) was featured in a Nov. 17 article in the Akron Beacon Journal for her role as founder of Chair-ity, a non-profit organization that helps those leaving foster care. The article focused on the non-profit's fundraiser, "Tailgating for Chair-ity," at the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton. According to Chair-ity's Facebook page, the event raised over \$76,000 to help young adults make the transition from foster care to independent living. The event included a "tailgate" meal, which guests enjoyed while watching



a Cleveland Browns football game, as well as a basket raffle, a silent auction and a cornhole tournament. Chair-ity provides those leaving foster care with furniture and other household items as they start life on their own. Chairity is based in Cleveland but serves six counties: Ashtabula, Cuyahoga, Lake, Medina, Stark, and Summit. The goal is to ensure a successful transition to independent living for young adults who age out of the foster care system by turning their house into a home. In December 2021, Chair-ity was selected as a "Diff Maker" by the Cleveland Cavaliers, which gave Chair-ity special recognition during a home game, including images on the "Humongotron" video scoreboard. Maria says, "I was honored to have Chair-ity's name and mission in front of so many people in one setting; it was an incredible way to educate and inform so many local peoples about the population we work with and our mission." Our school uses Friendzy's biblical model, which teaches students God's design for friendship. Using the lens of scripture, the Friendzy program focuses on teaching self-awareness, self-management, responsible decision-making, social awareness, and relationship skills. With each unit, the Friendzy program incorporates different scripture verses and provides activities, handouts, and even graphics such as the one on the cover of this newsletter to help the lesson take root. The school often combines Friendzy lessons with activities in which older students work with their younger "buddies," helping to foster a sense of community throughout the school.

Principal Rohr states that educating the learners at St. Sebastian Parish School requires a focus not only on the mind, but also on the body and spirit. He explains, "We know that emotions affect how and why students learn and that social and emotional literacy supports success in every part of a student's life, and this is why we believe the Friendzy program has been such a great addition to our curriculum. Learning social-emotional skills is vital, especially given the change and uncertainty we have faced over the last two years during the pandemic. Our teachers know they can't help students unlock their full academic potential without first unlocking their full
