

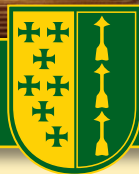

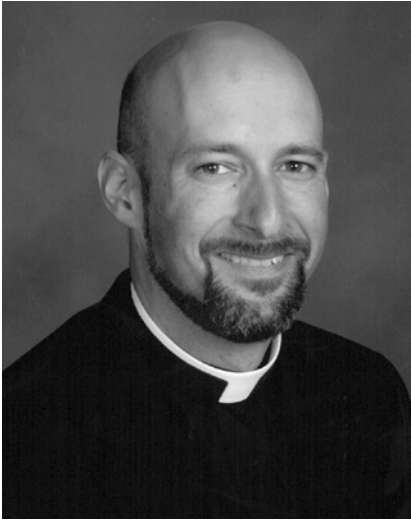

Collection Counters

Our weekend collection is counted on Sunday morning with a rotating team on a once a month schedule. Members gather at 10:30 a.m. on Sunday to count all three weekend Masses usually ending by 12 noon. Volunteers are needed in both routine and substitute capacities.

Finance Council

It is the responsibility of the Parish Finance Council to advise and aid the pastor in the administration of the parish finances in order to carry out the mission of the Parish.

Grounds Crew

St. Sebastian takes tremendous pride in its campus. Volunteers work Thursday mornings and one Saturday morning a month from April to October to plan, plant, and mulch flower beds. A small group works weekly to maintain the beds by weeding, watering, etc. All parishioners are invited to help keep our grounds in tip-top shape.

Parish Council

Parish Council is an advisory group for the pastor. It seeks to foster parish unity, assesses parish needs, develop parish programs, coordinate parish activities, encourage parish participation in spiritual and apostolic life and provide a forum for parish dialogue.

Giving Tree

Many of our neighbors have little, often lacking even life's bare necessities. The Giving Tree offers parishioners the opportunity to meet those needs during the Christmas Season. The work of this seasonal ministry (Advent), which requires some coordination with local charities and parish organizations, entails setting up, maintenance and clean-up of three trees, construction of ornaments, gathering of gifts and, finally, delivery to these charities on two weekends in December.

Good Samaritan Hunger Center

The Good Samaritan Hunger Center provides food to Akron area residents faced with hunger; low-income individuals and families, the homeless, the unemployed, the elderly, the mentally and physically disabled. GSHC is unusual because it is mobile: Hot meals are served and bags of food are handed out at at-risk locations in the Summit County area. Volunteers are needed to serve hot meals and distribute bags of food Monday through Friday from 2:30 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. at the various sites.

Medical Transportation Ministry

Volunteers are needed during the week to take parishioners, who cannot drive due to health or other reasons, to their doctor and/or other medical appointments.

Nazareth Housing

Nazareth Housing Development Corp. is a faith-based non-profit organization that provides affordable housing assistance to low and moderate income families in our community. Nazareth provides new home construction, home rehabilitation and down-payment assistance for first time home buyers. Volunteers are needed for office support, grant writing, fundraising, and “work sessions” on various projects. Help us make a house a Home.

Operation Rice Bowl

Operation Rice Bowl benefits Catholic Relief Services.(CRS). CRC is the right arm of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops in giving not only financial assistance to foreign countries in need but by promoting true development in poorer countries. The Operation Rice Bowl is a major fundraiser for them and St. Sebastian Parish and school participate by praying, collecting loose change to give, by fasting to be in solidarity with those less fortunate and by learning more about the plight of other countries to be aware of the bigger issues in our world. The children enthusiastically give every year and learn what it means to give generously. In so doing, they themselves receive even more by learning to serve others.

The Peter Maurin Center

Located in the Summit Lake neighborhood of south Akron, where 37% of the people live below the poverty line and the population is the youngest in Akron, this center tries to provide basic needs to these residents. St. Sebastian parishioners prepares dinner once a month for the center.

Adult Faith Formation

Faith Formation does not stop after Confirmation or First Communion. There is always more to learn about Christ and His Church and how to live that Faith in the world. The Adult Faith Formation Committee meets to discuss and plan opportunities for adults to grow in faith. This includes bible studies, book clubs, movie series, and more.

Baptism Preparation Team

A dedicated group of lay leaders prepare parents and godparents to understand and appreciate the responsibilities that come with the Sacrament of Baptism. Members prepare the sacramental to be used during the baptism and assist the families that day.

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Bible Study

St. Jerome said, "To be ignorant of Scripture is to be ignorant of Christ." Studying the Bible is very much a part of being Catholic. St. Sebastian Parish Church offers different bible study series throughout the year. Delve into Scripture and draw closer to Christ.

Catechist Formation

Christ commanded His disciple to go out and teach all nations. Having received the gift of faith in baptism, we need to delve deeper into knowing the truth of Christ. We have great catechists in our PSR program teaching preschool - grade 8. They are indispensable in helping parents pass on the Faith to their children. A great way to learn the Faith well, is by teaching it to others. There is required training involved for one interested in being a catechist.

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW)

During the Scripture readings and homily at the 4:30 p.m. Saturday Vigil Mass and 11:00 a.m. Sunday Mass, children in kindergarten through 2nd grade go and hear the Word of God at an age-appropriate level. Adults are needed to lead and assist in proclaiming the Word and engage children in faith-filled activities. No registration is necessary. The children will be called up before the first reading to go with their respective age group. Ages 5-8 will line up on the left side of the altar.

Confirmation

The sacrament of Confirmation allows the students to become fully initiated members of the Catholic Church and occurs during the student's 8th grade year. The program consists of four meetings in the church, an overnight retreat and the Confirmation Mass in February or March with a Bishop presiding. The students will also have to select a sponsor, a confirmation name, do 20 hours of service and write a letter to the Bishop.

Faith Lodge

Held every Thursday at 7 pm in Forest Lodge, doors open at 6:30. A different speaker each week will discuss current topics regarding our Catholic Faith. Coffee and desserts are served.

First Communion

The sacrament of First Communion is the third sacrament students receive. St. Sebastian Parish School students and PSR students work together to prepare for the sacrament of First Communion which is celebrated during the Second Grade school year. Preparation for this sacrament includes home instruction, religion and PSR classes at school, and special catechetical meetings on several evenings with parents, students, teachers, and priests. Students are then prepared to receive the sacrament towards the end of the school year during a special parish mass in May.

Jesus Day

Jesus Day is a special retreat day for second graders. During Jesus Day, our second graders join together with our second grade PSR students to strengthen their relationship with God by participating in meaningful activities such as a “Church Search” and a service project. Jesus Day is held just before the second graders’ First Communion.

Junior High Youth Ministry

Jr. High Youth Ministry programs provide a safe, caring and accepting environment for 7th & 8th graders in the parish and offer a wide range of activities designed to promote the spiritual, social, and service components integral for effective Catholic youth ministry. Activities include monthly faith-based meetings, social and service activities, as well as one annual retreat. Volunteers are needed to help chaperone, drive, and assist at meetings.

Parish School of Religion (PSR)

Public school students from 4 years of age to 8th grade receive religious instruction every Sunday from 9:30-10:45 a.m.

Peer Music Ministry Group

This music group meets every Monday from 7 pm – 8:30 pm. Plays music for Confirmation, Youth Masses, and retreats.

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Reconciliation

St. Sebastian Parish School students and PSR students work together to prepare for the sacrament of Reconciliation, which is celebrated during the Second Grade school year. Preparation for this sacrament includes home instruction, religion and PSR classes at school, and special catechetical meetings on several evenings with parents, students, teachers, and priests. Reconciliation is celebrated with a communal penance service in December and includes students and their families. Later in the year, the students participate in another penance service with the school during the Lenten season.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA)

The RCIA team always appreciates people who want to help with hospitality and welcoming potential new members of the Catholic Church. The sessions are times of learning, discussion, and faith sharing. There are also volunteers who facilitate the reflection period for the catechumens who are dismissed from the 9:00 a.m. Mass on Sunday.

Senior High Youth Ministry

Sr. High Youth Ministry programs provide a safe, caring and accepting environment for high school students of the parish and offer a wide range of activities designed to promote the spiritual, social, and service components integral for effective Catholic youth ministry. Activities include monthly faith-based meetings, social and service activities, as well as an annual retreat.

Vacation Bible School

VBS is offered in the summer for any child in grades K-5. Adult and teen volunteers lead activities which encourage children to grow in their relationship with Christ while having fun.

Young Adults Group (Ages 20s - 30s)

This group meets on Sundays from 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. at Forest Lodge. You don't need to be single or married to participate; you don't even need to be a member of the parish. All you need is a thirst for God's word and a willingness to share what it means with others your age. We also discuss encyclicals and other books on occasion.

Altar Servers

Altar servers assist the priest for daily and weekend liturgies. Interested boys and girls, grade 5 through high school, must participate in training sessions and periodic refreshers. Young men are needed to serve at the Extraordinary Form Mass.

Art & Environment

Members plan and prepare the church for liturgical and secular seasons with an appreciation and understanding of Catholic liturgy. Parishioners are welcome to contribute their gifts of designing, decorating, sewing, woodworking or other visual arts.

Cutting Garden for the Sanctuary

The cutting garden was established as a low cost alternative to provide flowers for the church sanctuary. It is located on the south side of the church building on Elmdale Avenue. Volunteers are needed to help with weeding, watering and general maintenance of the garden. Volunteers with some expertise in floral arranging are needed, as well

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

EMHCs distribute the Eucharist under both species for liturgies and special events. Parishioners are nominated by current EMHCs and must be approved by the pastor. Both diocesan and parish training are required. For those seeking more involvement, an EMHC may complete extra training to become a Mass Coordinator, one who oversees the duties of the liturgical ministers at the weekend or holy day liturgies.

General Intercessions

This committee meets to pray, reflect on the Sunday readings and write the Prayers of the Faithful proclaimed at the Sunday liturgies.

Lectors

These men and women proclaim the Scriptures during the Mass. As the Word is a central element of the liturgy, lectors must be willing to study the readings and proclaim them with understanding. Training is provided.

Cantors

Cantors lead the assembly in worship and song. A pleasant voice and a welcoming demeanor are essential. The ministry is open to anyone Junior High age or older. Training is provided; rehearsals are held seasonally.

Children's Cherubim Choir (Grades K-2)

Children's Christmas and Easter Choir is open to all children grades K-2. Rehearsals are on the second, third and fourth Wednesday of the month from 3:00 - 4:00 p.m. at the church for 8 weeks prior to Christmas and Easter.

Children's Seraphim Choir (Grades 3-8)

Children's Christmas and Easter Choir is open to all children grades 3-8. These rehearsals are on Wednesdays from 4:00 - 5:00 p.m. at the church for 8 weeks prior to Christmas and Easter.

Gregorian Schola

This is the Extraordinary Form Mass choir that sings at the 1:00 p.m. Extraordinary Form Mass. Hymns of both English and Latin based along with Gregorian Chant are performed. Rehearsals are on Tuesdays at 8 p.m. year round. No audition required.

Handbell Choir

Through the unique sounds of bells, members enhance liturgies during the year and participate in other musical outreach programs. The ability to read music is not required. Rehearsals are weekly from September to May. Membership is open to teens and adults. An audition is required.

Parish Choir

Parish Choir sings traditional and multicultural music for Sunday Liturgy as well as for other special occasions. Open to teens and adults with pleasant singing voices, they rehearse weekly from September to June. They are available to perform for prayer and social gatherings. No audition is necessary and the ability to read music is optional.

Praise and Worship Ensemble

This group provides a wide variety of instrumental, vocal, and ensemble music for Sunday Liturgies and special occasions. Teens and adults with a pleasant singing voice or capable instrumental skills are welcome.

Athletics/CYO

Catholic Youth Organization (CYO) is a group that fosters participation in athletics for youth. All children of the parish, no matter what school they attend, may participate in CYO sports. The program is always in need of women and men to coach all sports.

Booster Club

The Boosters are a group of interested parents and parishioners devoted to maintaining a sports program at St. Sebastian Parish School. Through their fund-raising programs, sports equipment and uniforms used in sports programs are purchased.

Boy Scouts/Troop 96

Troop 96 offers a year round camping and weekly activity program for boys ages 11 through 17 and beyond. Our program here at St. Sebastian includes monthly outings and a week of summer camp each July. Scouting is primarily a boy lead program with close support of adult leaders. Scouting teaches life skills in socialization and leadership while having fun at the same time. Opportunities for adult volunteering are also available with many options for support and training.

Bridge Flights

Both singles and couples with an interest in bridge, fellowship and fun are encouraged to join! The flights meet once a month from September through May. A portion of the dues are donated for parish needs.

Brownies & Girl Scouts

Cinematheque Faith and Art in Cinema

John Paul II said that viewers should know how to react in a critical way in the face of the ever more demanding proposals offered by the world of the media, including the cinema, and be ready to judge between what may be an opportunity for growth or an occasion of harm. With this in mind, Art and Faith in Cinema was conceived to educate others to become more discriminating in their choice of media by providing an alternative to movies in wide release, and to screen films that provoke reflection, good entertainment, artistically beautiful, and uphold our Catholic moral values. According to Cardinal Poupard, president of the Pontifical Council for Culture, cinema should be regarded as an irreplaceable vehicle of communication and evangelization. Art and Faith in Cinema hopes to use the films being screened as a means to discuss our Catholic faith and values.

Handmade Prayer Shawls

Prayer Shawls are knitted or crocheted as gifts of comfort and caring. They are blessed and given to people who are in need of healing, strength and prayer. Those who knit or crochet are welcome to be part of this ministry.

Knights of Columbus

The Knights of Columbus is a fraternal service organization of men, founded under the principles of charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism. This organization provides men with a vehicle for building up the parish community and family life with an emphasis on family, youth, church, council, and community activities.

Little Flower Garden Club

Pre-Cana

An important part of wedding preparation is the Pre-Cana session. The program helps couples entering marriage for the first time to better understand each other and the importance and dignity of married life.

Sanctuary Society

Sanctuary Society, which includes all women of the parish, is financially responsible for all items relating to the sanctuary: altar breads, wine, candles, flowers, and vestments for the clergy, etc. Monies are raised through various events as well as through annual dues and donations. Sanctuary Society is always looking for volunteers to help with their fundraisers as well as serve on the operating board.

Ski Club

All parishioners and students are invited to hit the local slopes during the winter months.

Surviving Spouses

This group for widows and widowers is committed to providing encouragement, with spiritual and social support, to those who have lost their spouse. They gather for a variety of activities in the spirit of prayer, fun and fellowship.

Toddler & Preschool Open Gym

Toddler & Preschool open gym takes place twice a month during the school year in Byrider Hall. This is an opportunity for children to meet new friends, practice social skills, and run off some of that pent up energy. Parents or caregivers must stay with their children the entire time.

Disciples for the Dying

This ministry meets once a month and offers prayers for people who have recently passed away. Mass rotates between St. Bernard, St. Sebastian and St. Vincent Parishes.

Ecumenical Efforts

The purpose of this group is to develop and maintain relationships with neighboring Christian churches, affording our parish the opportunity to meet, greet, promote harmony, celebrate and worship together. Events include picnics, book reviews, speakers and joint worship services. Volunteers are needed to help plan as well as assist with physical needs of such events.

Emmaus Roundtable

An Evangelization and Apologetic Workshop that teaches Catholics how to explain and defend the truths of the Catholic Church.

Faith & Light Community

Faith & Light Communities are prayer groups made up of persons with intellectual disabilities, their families and anyone wanting to be their friends. They meet together on a regular basis in Christian spirit to share friendship, prayer and celebrate life.

Funeral Luncheons

Easing the pain of grieving families, this group coordinates the receptions or luncheons which accompany parish funerals. Volunteers are needed to set-up, serve, and clean-up after the event. **Please note:** this group does **not** provide food for the luncheons.

Legion of Mary

Through a devotion to the Blessed Mother, members seek a sanctified life through prayer and service. They attend weekly meetings and also perform the apostolic work of taking Communion to area nursing homes, hospitals and senior day care centers while promoting their devotion to Mary.

Ministry to the Sick

So much of Jesus' ministry was healing the sick. Whether through his miraculous cures or his peaceful presence, He brought God's healing touch. All of us are called to heal the sick in some way and every time we visit someone in the hospital or one who is homebound we participate in Jesus' healing ministry. In addition, St. Sebastian Parish has a staff member to visit hospitals on an almost daily basis to visit sick parishioners and bring Holy Communion. We also have a group of dedicated parishioners (including but not exclusively the Legion of Mary) who also visit the sick helping them to keep connected with our church and community.

Mother of Sorrows Support Group

Mother of Sorrows is a support group for the bereaved. This ministry is one of worship, service and healing. Members attend all parish funerals to offer support and consolation through prayer, song and group presence.

Respect Life Committee

This ministry is dedicated to defending human life from conception to natural death. The committee works to build a "culture of life," primarily through prayer, but also by educating the community about current legislation and practices that uphold the dignity of life. With volunteer help, activities are organized throughout the year: Life Chain, Mother's Day carnation sale, Crosses for Life display and the Right to Life media campaign.

St. Vincent-DePaul Society

A traditional Catholic organization, it provides care for the poor within the parish boundaries through the distribution of funds, blankets and food. Referrals to outside social service agencies may provide additional assistance for clients.

Social Justice

This group seeks to lead the parish and community effort that responds to the call of Jesus – through prayer, education, advocacy and action – to raise awareness of today's social issues and implement the Church's mission of justice. Together, members read, study and discuss issues of social justice locally, nationally and internationally, in order to educate themselves, the parish and the community. They meet monthly.

Adoration (Eucharistic)

McDonough Resource Library

This library, located in the rear of the church, is the perfect quiet spot to read or study our Catholic Faith. It houses an extensive collection of books, periodicals, audio and video tapes, and equipment for the use of parishioners and catechists. Additional volunteers are needed to help maintain this valuable resource.

Men's Breakfast Club

Open to all Catholic men, the breakfast club meets on the first Saturday of each month to reinforce the grace available through camaraderie, shared faith, and commitment to each other and the church. Our primary mission is to allow Jesus to open the spiritual eyes of these men and to set their hearts ablaze for Christ, helping them to become truly men, truly Catholic.

Prayer Line

When parishioners request special prayers, their intentions are passed to many people via the Parish Prayer Line. This is an effective way to intercede for important prayer intentions. New intercessors are always welcome.

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Retreats

Retreats held at Loyola Retreat House in Portage Lakes, are offered to parishioners as a way to deepen and continue their spiritual journey and build a faith community. Both the men's and women's retreats are held on a weekend in Lent. Additional retreats are scheduled in autumn depending upon interest. Volunteers are essential in the success of these retreats.

Rosary Cenacle of Prayer – Church

Based on Fr. Gobi's "Marian Movement of Priests," parishioners meet in Church every Friday from 1:00 - 1:30 p.m. to pray for the needs of the Church, for vocations and for individual intentions. The Rosary is also prayed daily after 8:00 a.m. Mass, and before the Saturday Vigil Mass at 4:00 p.m. All parishioners are welcome to join us.

Rosary Cenacle of Prayer – Home

- **Yearbook** – Each HASA dues-paying family will receive one complimentary yearbook. Additional copies are available for purchase. Pictures are needed for classrooms and events.
- **Athletic Gear Swap** – In conjunction with the Booster Club, students have the opportunity to swap outgrown gear such as cleats, jerseys, etc.

One Day a Year

Each household with St. Sebastian Parish School students is asked to volunteer a total of 24 hours a year to the church and/or school (single parent families, 12 hours). One Day a Year will help provide structure and accountability for much of the volunteer work that's already taking place and bring many more parents into the volunteer fold. Playground Monitor

Trained parent volunteers supervise all St. Sebastian Parish School students on the playground during lunch recess. There are always at least 3 playground monitors present each day.

Room Parent

Room parents work together with volunteer parents and teachers to provide snacks and activities for the: Halloween Party/Social, Christmas Service Project, Teacher Appreciation Week, Teacher Birthday Recognition, 1st Communion and Reconciliation, school picnic and miscellaneous needs of teachers. The commitment is approximately 1-2 hours per activity. Much of the work can be done at home by simply making phone calls for volunteers. Room parents are organized and kept informed through the year by the room parent committee members.

Sebastian's Garden

Sebastian's Garden is designed to meet two goals. First, the space is intended for teachers and students to use as an outdoor classroom/ laboratory for lessons and experiences about organic gardening, nutrition, and science. Second, it is intended to provide community members with access to fresh produce. Help plant, harvest and maintain the garden.

September Spectacular

The September Spectacular is our Parish school's largest fundraiser. Now in its tenth year, we have raised a total of more than \$385,000. These funds have been used for tuition reduction for every child – K through 8th grade – and to purchase new technology for the classrooms. September Spectacular is an evening event; the themed dinner, live and silent auctions are held each year in Zwisler Hall. September Spectacular is organized by a committee of dedicated individuals who work tirelessly throughout the year to put on a successful and entertaining fundraiser for our school.
