The cutting garden is starting to awaken from its slumber also. This is the garden that keeps our sanctuary in


flowers all through the warmer months. If you would like to be involved in this project, please contact Karen Spangler at spangrila 276@yahoo.com.

### FROM THE FORGOTTEN CABINET

For 1948 there was but one, lonely letter in the whole school file. It was from the Rev. C. E. Elwell Superintendent of Catholic Schools concerning his visit to the school. Overall, the school received many compliments but for this, "My visit revealed that your school generally is doing good work, but not quite as good, however, as one would expect from a school with pupils nearly all of whom are in the upper half of the intellectual population." I hope that Monsignor is receiving some consolation in heaven now that his school is recognized as one of the best schools in the whole nation as a Blue Ribbon School!

It was noted that the classrooms had too many students in them (a common problem at the time) and there were too many class plays and that perhaps combining grade levels into groups to put on plays would keep the benefits of such activities while being able to devote more time to other academic work.

The letter rounded up in this manner:

"There is a fine, free, friendly spirit in your children which bespeaks a nice contact and relationship with their priests. There are also many other items which are highly commendable - to mention one, the exceptional physical condition of the building and its equipment and surroundings. I am certain the parents appreciate your school, as I do, and I trust my visit may have been of benefit."

At the time, the school building would have only been 20 years old. As we encroach upon 100 years, I think our founders (and the Rev. Elwell) would have been impressed with how well those stately buildings and grounds continue to be maintained and we are grateful to them for providing us such well-built and beautiful buildings with which to work.
